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ADVISORY COUNCIL ON AGING

In accordance with the Older Americans Act, the Contra Costa County Advisory Council on Aging (ACOA) is appointed by the Board of Supervisors to advise them on all matters associated with the planning, development and administration of programs relating to older adults. The ACOA is staffed by representatives of the Contra Costa County Area Agency on Aging (AAA). The ACOA acts as an advisory body to the Board of Supervisors in the development and implementation of the County's Area Plan by the Department of Aging and Adult Services.

Seats and Qualifications

The Council consists of representatives of the target population and the general public, including older low-income and military persons. At least one-half of the membership must be made up of actual consumers of services under the Area Plan. The Council includes representatives recommended from each Local Committee on Aging (19), one representative each from the Nutrition Project Council (1) and the Retired Senior Volunteer Program (1). The remainder are members at-large (19).

AIRPORT LAND USE COMMISSION

The purpose of an Airport Land Use Commission (ALUC) is to conduct airport land use compatibility planning. ALUCs protect public health, safety, and welfare by ensuring the orderly expansion of airports and the adoption of land use measures that minimize the public's exposure to excessive noise and safety hazards within areas around public airports to the extent that these areas are not already devoted to incompatible uses. The statutes governing ALUCs are set forth in Division 9, Part 1, Chapter 4, Article 3.5, Sections 21670 – 21679.5 of the California Public Utilities Code (PUC).

Seats and Qualifications

The Airport Land Use Commission (ALUC) consists of seven (7) members as follows: Two (2) appointees of the Board of Supervisors (BOS No. 1 and BOS No. 2); Two (2) appointees of the Airport Manager (Airport Manager No. 1 and No. 2); one (1) At-Large appointed by the balance of the ALUC; and Two (2) appointed by other local jurisdictions: one member from Contiguous Jurisdictions and one member from Non-Contiguous jurisdictions (i.e., based on proximity to the airport).

Term limits are set by the State Aeronautics (4-year terms).

The board reports their findings and recommendations to the Contra Costa Health Services Department, the Board of Supervisors and the communities they serve.

The Alcohol and Other Drugs Advisory Board works in collaboration with the Alcohol and Other Drugs Services of Contra Costa Health Services. The board provides input and recommendations as they pertain to alcohol and other drugs prevention, intervention, and treatment services. Current Vacancies

CONTRA COSTA COUNTY EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT ASSOCIATION (CCCERA)

The Contra Costa County Employees' Retirement Association (CCCERA) is a public employee retirement system established pursuant to the California Government Code and other relevant laws. CCCERA is administered by a Board of Directors that is separate from the Board of Supervisors.

Seats and Qualifications

The Contra Costa County Employees' Retirement Association is comprised of both elected and appointed seats, as outlined below.

Elected Seats: Six (6) of the seats on the 12-member Retirement Board are elected by their membership group: two by active general members, two by active safety members, and two by retired members. Nominations for candidates should be directed to the Contra Costa County Elections Department.

Appointed Seats: Five (5) members of the Retirement Board are appointed by the Board of Supervisors. To be considered, candidates must be County residents, must not be CCCERA members or retirees, and may not market any investment, consulting, or related service to CCCERA's Retirement Board or any other 1937 Act Retirement Board.

In addition, the County Treasurer serves on the Retirement Board in an ex officio capacity.

CONTRA COSTA COUNTY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE (BOS APPOINTEE)

The purpose of the Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA) Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) is to provide citizen perspective, participation, and involvement in Authority policy development and implementation.

The CAC reviews transportation issues pertaining to Contra Costa County, advising and providing recommendations to the Transportation Authority's Board. Among other transportation issues the committee will assist the Authority in reviewing the Biennial Growth Management Compliance checklists submitted by local jurisdictions.

Seats and Qualifications

Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA) Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) is composed of 19 members from Contra Costa County. Each member jurisdiction is requested to nominate one member to be appointed by the Board of Supervisors to the CCTA CAC. Of the 19 members, the Contra Costa Board of Supervisors nominates one member and one alternate. Appointees should be citizens with an active interest in transportation, planning and/or growth management.
